Hi All. We're here again....talking about Covid-19. We are in the fortunate position of having a very well ventilated school with space and while I have no doubt we have Covid-19 cases lurking, with cooperation and constant vigilance, we can keep the wolf from the door. As you know the format of Contact tracing that had run has been discontinued. There is pressure mounting to continue it as the number of cases increases. We will, of course, do our best to make the school as safe as possible. However, we have only been contacted on three occasions of a positive case in classes – by the parents themselves and the HSE, when contacted on the hotline said to maintain vigilance and adhere to protocols etc. Thank you all for your support and - in some cases - tolerance at this time. We all have to work extra hard to navigate the constantly changing challenges presented to us despite the confusing messages from authorities. (Spare a thought for those who have English as a second language. How can they grasp the contradictory messaging we are all receiving?) We are just trying to carry on as best we can and not upset our children. We try reassure them that we are all keeping them safe and we realise there is much anxiety out there at the moment.

Sticking to the basic rules seems to be the best plan at this time. Proper hand hygiene, cough etiquette "social distancing", face coverings and VENTILATION are important and we all have to shoulder the responsibility - complacency is the enemy.

Please ensure your child does not arrive at school too early. Please model best practice in front of the pupils.

Substitution Issues.

Many, but not all teacher absences are substitutable. Since last academic year and for this academic year the Department has allowed some absences to be substituted that previously were not allowed. (Last academic year, if a substitute was not available, the school could "bank" those hours and use them again when a substitute became available. This was moderately beneficial but surprisingly ceased for this academic year. We all heard through the media. When I become aware of a teacher absence I have 4 options after I check whether the leave is substitutable or not. 1. We are in a cluster of 19 schools to avail of a Substitute Group. 2. I also have my own separate list of substitutes. 3. Subseeker is with the Irish Primary Principals' Network (IPPN) and 4. Our I.N.T.O. union has Teacher Connect. We have struggled to get substitutes and often we have no choice but to use our Special Education Teachers to fill the gap. This is a common practice. Our Deputy Principal, Mr. Gallagher has substituted for teachers on many, many occasions. I have also taken classes but nothing like Mr. Gallagher's number. The issue has been brewing for a number of years and first reared its head when a 3-year course became a 4-year course. There was a sudden shudder in the system and it has not really recovered. Rest assured we are trying our best to prioritise the needs of the pupils — as always — and we were all disheartened to hear inaccuracies and declarations about the problems shared in the media. (while in classes once again, I am very impressed with many excellent, appropriate healthy lunches. Some parents should really publish a Healthy interesting Lunches book)

Covid Learning And Support Scheme (CLASS)

The Department of Education has launched an initiative where school are given additional teaching hours to best support some children who may have been disproportionally affected by Covid-19. We hope to run this after Hallowe'en.

MOBILE PHONES and Tablets

Mobile Phones and Tablets are great and really useful. Few words to the wise, if your child is due to get one, download an app that gives you information and control over the phone and agree its usage well in advance of purchase. Have that conversation! Don't fall prey to 'pester power'. Not everyone is getting one! There is increasing evidence suggesting the earlier the introduction of phone/Tablet devices in a child's life (aged 8, 9), the less well they fare in literacy and numeracy as well as other developments.

Also, ask yourself – what could my child be doing or learning instead of them being on the phone? How might they be missing out on say creativity?, boredom?, imaginative games?, conversation?, activity? etc. while they are often being just end-users on the phone? Please also realise that unless you have filters, your child will get access to unsuitable/ explicit material. Make sure you're comfortable with that. Don't live in denial.

Third Class News







Ross's class also made playdough, mixed colours and learned about different types of houses. The children have enjoyed learning about Autumn too and are really looking forward to Halloween












Fourth Class News

We have now updated the 'Attendance & Notes' Section of your Aladdin App. You can now also enter reasons in advance for a future absence or if your child will be late or leaving school early, which will save on writing any notes into school. Thank you!

Compliments again to the <u>vast</u> majority of parents who drive safely and with awareness and care. Please see our website for traffic management in the school. Please be vigilant as some drivers are parking precariously and driving selfishly.
